- IV. ALBERTA FOREST PRODUCTS ASSOCIATION (AFPA) PROPOSED REVISION TO SECTION 6.2.2 OF THE ALSC LUMBER ENFORCEMENT REGULATIONS

The AFPA has submitted a request for changes to the ALSC Lumber Enforcement Regulations in Section 6.2.2. The proposed changes address the current requirements allowing HT lumber below specific sizes to be stamped a minimum of 25% of the pieces and the units stenciled and reflects the current practices found in the Wood Packaging industry.

- V. PELLET FUELS INSTITUTE (PFI) PROPOSAL FOR REVISION OF THE ALSC RESIDENTIAL/COMMERCIAL DENSIFIED FUEL ENFORCEMENT REGULATIONS, THE PFI STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL/COMMERCIAL DENSIFIED FUEL, AND THE PFI RESIDENTIAL/ COMMERCIAL DENSIFIED FUEL QA/QCC HANDBOOK

PFI has submitted proposed changes to the ALSC Residential/Commercial Densified Fuel Enforcement Regulations. The proposed revisions address modifications being proposed to the PFI Standard Specifications for Residential/Commercial Densified Fuel and the PFI Residential/Commercial Densified Fuel QA/QC Handbook to address feedback and facilitate adoption of the PFI Standard by state regulators in the northeast.

VI. REQUESTED CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED REVISIONS TO ALSC FUMIGATED WOOD/FUMIGATED WOOD PACKAGING ENFORCEMENT REGULATIONS

In their review of agency performance, the ALSC Board of Review has discussed difficulty agencies accredited in the Fumigated Wood/ Fumigated Wood Packaging program have in consistently monitoring facilities conducting off-site fumigation projects. This is due to limited advance notice agencies receive regarding many of these fumigation projects. The Board of Review requested the Enforcement Subcommittee take this issue under consideration and asked staff to submit language for review and discussion that can address this issue.

VII. PROPOSED REVISIONS TO THE ALSC TREATED WOOD POLICY AND THE ALSC TREATED WOOD ENFORCEMENT REGULATIONS.

AWPA has made substantial changes to their standards since the last revision of the treated wood policy and the treated wood enforcement regulations in 2013. The proposed changes to this regulation are intended to bring the language of the enforcement regulations in line with these changes.

VII. PROPOSED REVISION TO SECTION 3.5 OF THE ALSC LUMBER ENFORCEMENT REGULATIONS

PLIB has submitted a request to revise section 3.5 of the ALSC lumber enforcement regulations that deals with MSR lumber production. The request adds an additional section that deals with the simultaneous production of grades of MSR lumber that have higher design values than No. 1 & Btr.
